ORCSD Superintendent Search

Superintendent Morse has announced his coming retirement at the end of the current school year and the ORCSD School Board has officially announced the search for his successor. The School Board invites highly qualified and future-focused candidates to apply for the position of Superintendent of Schools, with a start date of July 1, 2024. The district has hired https://document.com/The New England School Development Council (NESDEC) to assist with the search. Applications are due on Oct 27, 2023.


The School Board invites the community to take part in the search by providing input during the search process. A survey will be provided on the district's website in September and shared with targeted stakeholders. Community members will also be invited to attend focus groups during the month of September.

The information gathered at these meetings and through the survey will be used to establish a profile of the preferred candidate. More information, including dates and locations, will be provided soon, including on the Superintendent Search page on the district's website. The webpage also contains more information about the entire search process, which is anticipated to run through the end of December 2023.

This session will help families navigate through the federal financial aid process including the FAFSA, explore what type of additional aid is available, review scholarship searches and highlight the importance of meeting deadlines. FAFSA Requirement: There is a **new state graduation requirement** that will take effect this school year. Each student who is eligible to graduate from high school, or the parent of such a student who is under the age of 18 years, shall either:

- 1. File a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) with the United States Department of Education; or
- 2. File a waiver on a form created by the state board of education with the student's school district indicating that the parent or guardian or, if applicable, the student, understands what the Free Application for Federal Student Aid is and has chosen not to file an application

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is part of the college application process for students seeking post-secondary education. The requirement is part of a college readiness initiative to ensure students understand the FAFSA is available, and they have access to financial aid if they choose to apply.
