As we move into the new semester, it's a good time to look at our systems and what is working well or can be improved upon. One issue that affects students has come up repeatedly from teachers, parents, and students: cell phones. There is an abundance of research that tells us how cell phones are a cause of or aide in causing: anxiety, sleep deficiencies, depression, inattention, stress. That "Cell phone usage badly affects mental health of adolescents..." (McNutt).

Our MTSS group, consisting of teachers and administrators, researched this issue in the 22-23 school year. They came up with purchasing "cell phone hotels" or charging stations for teachers as a positive way to help with cell phone usage in the classroom. This has worked well in many classrooms. We are working this semester to implement these positive stations or other positive ideas in all classrooms, so students can focus on their learning, their teacher, and their classmates. We all want to help our students to be healthy, happy, and learning. We want students to learn how to use their phones, not let their phones control them. Being able to put our phones down and focus on why we are here will be a good start.
