Hello Parents & Guardians,

Yesterday, we held class meetings to make sure all students had the same understanding of what we have experienced with Hate Speech and vandalism in the school. Our focus was on why we were meeting, a common understanding of Hate Speech, what has been implemented so far, and the effects this vandalism has caused. We then focused on and asked the question, "What do we stand for?" We reviewed the mission statement for the district and I asked students to think about what it means to be a Bobcat. Who are we and who do we want to be? Starting with what we as a community do next, will define who we become. We made sure students knew this was our first step and we would have more conversations. Students moved to Advisory where Advisors facilitated conversations on what was presented.

The feedback I've received shows the conversations varied. Some Advisories talked about next steps, some talked about consequences, some had questions and wanted more education, and there were many other discussions that happened. Overall, a step in a positive direction. As a faculty, we are debriefing the activity on Monday and will look at where we go from here with all of the student input. I hope you'll join us for the Parent Forum on November 27th at 6:30. (More details below).

Students took the conversation seriously; they want to keep learning and want this to stop. I was extremely impressed with the feedback on the Advisory discussions. We have great kids that want to do really good things. We will make sure those good things happen.


