Oyster River High School National Parks Trip Occurring Over April Vacation

Is your student unsure of what they want to do when they get out of high school? The ASVAB (Armed Serviced Vocational Aptitude Battery) test provides students with great information about possible careers that match your skills. Scores are **NOT** released to the armed services; they are solely used for career exploration purposes. A student can, however, use them for military entrance if they choose. The ASVAB test will be offered to students in grades 10-12 on Monday, November 13th in the MPR during W1, W2, and possibly a few minutes into W3.
