Dear Oyster River,

As A.A. Milne, the author of Winnie the Pooh, said, "How lucky am I to have something that makes saying goodbye so hard."

I am both sad and excited to share that I will be retiring on June 30, 2024. Sad because I will miss all of you, and excited to start a new chapter in my life. I've been an educator for 47 years and did not anticipate education to be my destiny. But when I entered a classroom as an art teacher in 1976, I knew I had found my calling.

Oyster River was my fourth superintendent position. When I started in the role, it was a difficult time in the district's history. Trust was low. My first goal was to bring us back together, which was achieved over the course of my first two years.

Shortly after, the School Board authorized the creation of the first five-year strategic plan. Their adoption of the plan laid the foundation for most work to follow and set the course for future budget development. We have since updated the plan that followed.

Over the past 11 years Oyster River has exemplified its mission of "Working Together to Engage Every Learner".

Some examples of our district's success during the last decade include:

- Near 100% graduation rate
- 100% graduation rate for students with disabilities
- An incredibly high college placement rate
- Some of the highest SAT scores in New Hampshire and the country
- Innovative programs like social-emotional learning and Muti-Tiered Systems of Support to assist all children
- Full day kindergarten
- Advanced mathematics program
- One-to-one devices for all students K-12

- Expansion of counseling and school psychologist staff
- New athletic fields at the middle school and high school
- A brand-new middle school which is the first project in New Hampshire to achieve LEED V4 Gold for Building Design and Construction
- Extended learning opportunities such as dual enrollment and UNH courses to supplement and enhance our high school, and so many others

Perhaps more notably, these remarkable achievements were accomplished by the ORCSD while considering their impact taxpayers. Our district budget's average growth over these past years was around 3% even when inflation soared.

I will dearly miss Oyster River, the amazing employees, the students, and all of you.

I am proud of OR students and proud of OR staff. I am thankful for the support of Durham, Lee, and Madbury. I'm grateful Barrington students can attend ORHS as it has allowed us to continue to offer a robust program of studies.

But most importantly, I will miss your amazing children. Their hunger for learning is unbridled and their commitment to each other is inspiring. I will always remember the excited faces of kindergarten children arriving on their first day of school and I'll remember the excitement of graduation. I call them the bookends of a child's school experience.

The Beatles sang, "There are places I'll remember all my life." ORCSD is that place for me.

learners and the equitable access to our rigorous academic program. Our robust Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) reflects this commitment and supports our ability to respond to the changing needs of students

What is a Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS)?

MTSS is a student-centered framework of support which individualizes student success within their academics and behavioral health. It provides a continuum to meet students' needs and ensures all students have equitable access to a high-quality and rigorous educational experience.

The MTSS framework includes three tiers:

- Universal Instruction (the general curriculum available to all students)
- Targeted Instruction (small temporary skill/content building groups)
- Intensive Instruction (focused individual or small group instruction not associated with special education)

Our MTSS school-based teams meet regularly to discuss student success. You and your student(s) are welcome to contact your school counselor or principal for grade-specific information.

Oyster River is committed to providing individualized instruction and equitable access to a relevant and rigorous academic experience for all students. Leadership, faculty, and staff are dedicated to our students, and we are fortunate to receive community support for education and wellness.

As we start this new school year, I am reminded of the importance of differentiating between belonging and fitting in.

In the book *Daring Greatly: How the Courage to Be Vulnerable Transforms the Way We Live, Love, Parent, and Lead*, author Dr. Brene Brown states, "One of the biggest surprises in this research was learning that fitting in and belonging are not the same thing. In fact, fitting in is one of the greatest barriers to belonging. Fitting in is about assessing a situation and becoming who you need to be in order to be accepted. Belonging, on the other hand, does not require us to change who we are; it requires us to be who we are."

At times, diversity can be mistaken as diverging from the larger whole. However, diversity is not about division; it is about building connections and understanding across differences. In my role as the DEIJ Director, I will continue to build these bridges across differences as this directly impacts and influences the district's inclusion efforts.

Last year, my focus was on introducing myself to the district, forming community partnerships, and providing applicable professional development to district leaders and educators. This year, I am looking forward to shifting some of that focus to provide an extra layer of support and resources to students to learn more about themselves and others.

This will include (but, not be limited to):

- Creating and holding spaces for students wanting to build community through shared identities
- Offering student-centered programming to learn more about the lived experiences of those in marginalized groups
- Working with a local organization to coordinate an elementary parent/caregiver group that will focus on providing additional guidance and education in supporting kids who identify within the LGBTQIA+ community

I hope these efforts will enhance our students' sense of self and belonging in our community.

2023 - 2024 School Year Registration

Families with incomplete forms must finalize their student(s)' registration in PowerSchool. Step-by-step instructions are available on the **district website here**.

Free and Reduced Meals Applications

Free and reduced meals applications can be <u>completed online</u>. Applications are also available at each school's front office and nurse's office upon request. Please be sure the application you complete has the current school year listed on it as we are, unfortunately, unable to accept previous years applications.

Bus Routes, Riding Rules & More

Information about bus routes, riding rules, schedules, and the <u>drop off release authorization</u> <u>form</u> (3rd and 4th grade only) are available on the <u>district website</u>. If you already completed a drop off authorization form for your student in PowerSchool during registration, there is no need to complete a second one. Students ride their bus unless arrangements are made directly with the Transportation office. Please note some buses are full and cannot accommodate more riders.

A second bus will be added for grades 9 to 12 Barrington students starting Tuesday, September 5. Please make sure to look up the <u>updated route</u>s to confirm both your bus stop location and pick-up time.

ORCSD Care

The ORCSD Care program offers coverage for school issued laptops, iPads, charges, and cases against loss, theft, and accidental damage from the day of distribution through the last day of school. It is

\$20 to join, and you can do so through <u>LinqConnect.com</u>. Coverage does not begin until a full payment is received, and families who choose to not join ORCSD Care program are liable for full replacement or repair costs. The ORCSD Care program is free for students who qualify for <u>free and</u> reduced meals.

ParentSquare Communications

District and school communications are now sent via ParentSquare. In 2023-2024, ParentSquare will be used for mass notifications, and you may expect additional features to become available next year. Parents and guardians are encouraged to register their account by visiting ParentSquare.com. Login information is the same as for PowerSchool. For those interested, a mobile application is available for both Android and iOS devices. Downloading the application is optional and will not affect your ability to receive messages.

Superintendent Search

NEW in 2023-2024! State Graduation Requirements

Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year, each student who is eligible to graduate from high school, or the parent of such a student who is under the age of 18 years, shall either:

- File a <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u> with the United States Department of Education; or
- <u>File a waiver</u> indicating that the parent or guardian or, if applicable, the student, understands what the Free Application for Federal Student Aid is and has chosen not to file an application
