- Potentially ask UNH students; the Beauregard Center, BSU, etc.
- Prompts:

- Create a visual: Ask kids to write and respond to prompt on different colored sticky notes; hang up on different large posters so everyone can look and read
 - Each grade level could be different colors of the rainbow
 - Could gather responses in advisory and influence the art teachers to create a visual
 - Can we get HS involved? Potentially have the broad question of belonging; have students contribute anonymously on a notecard and have the instructor read out loud

TO DO:

- Create welcoming/introduction message
- Connect with Elementary & MS Art teachers; have students respond to question prompts in Advisory discussion on different sticky notes
- Design HS advisory activity to get responses on belonging
- Identify top 3 inspiring speakers and develop key prompts for them to shape their stories
 - o Coach them
 - Inquire about honorariums
- Order refreshments
- Create flyer and title; Instagram graphic?
 - Share with community partners
- Identify orgs to help partner and sponsor
