This Memo is to summarize the Barrington Tuition student's Academic Loss and Recovery Strategies.

Academic Loss/Recovery Strategies:

Data, standardized tests, doesn't support academic learning loss. However, our qualitative data shows us that there is a difference in students' school readiness. Examples: challenges with sustained attention, a need for reminders about behavior expectations, executive functioning skills (organization, handing work in on time, long-term project management).

This Memo is to summarize the Barrington Tuition student's Social/Emotional Interventions.

Social-Emotional Learning Loss:

Students have experienced Covid impacts such as social isolation, chronic stress, and trauma. Their communication for an extended period of time was primarily online and through texts. This has caused an increase in emotional sensitivity, less grit, and a reduced amount of practice of appropriate behaviors in the school setting.

For SY22-23:

76 ORHS students participated in CTE. Of the 76, 13 were students who reside in Barrington. Of the 13, 13 attended Dover and the other 2 attended Somersworth and/or Rochester.

For SY21-22:

69 ORHS students participated in CTE. Of the 69, 18 were students who reside in Barrington. Of the 18, 13 attended Dover and the other 5 attended Somersworth and/or Rochester.

For SY20-21:

57 ORHS students participated in CTE. Of the 57, 10 were students who reside in Barrington. • Of the 13, 10 attended Dover and the other 3 attended Somersworth and/or Rochester.
