- IV. Discussion with Assistant Superintendent Todd Allen about the District's curriculum
  - 1. Purpose for this meeting- Cristina spoke to the interest, by the full ORSC members, to learn more about the curricula and the presence of sustainability across grades and disciplines.
  - 2. Outline overall curricula elements/process in the District

Todd spoke about the general process of curricula development. It generally takes 2-3 years for a curriculum to be approved and used by all.

Currently the plan being considered for curricula: Next year the science curriculum will begin with a year of "awareness." 2016-2017 the Science Curricula will be reviewed. 2019-2010 the Science Curriculum will be implementation.

Courses in the District where the term "sustainability" was found across all curricula.

3. Share examples of current curricula that includes topics of sustainability across District Some examples:

9<sup>th</sup> grade biology includes Earth, Ocean, and Space with aspects of sustainability Environmental Science includes many, many areas.

The Middle School has had some shifting of classes to align with Next Gen

Social Studies also holds areas related to sustainability.

C3 Standards will need to be considered (along with Next Gen)

Bringing Next Gen into Civic classes (Cit Ed)

Nell: Local partnerships/non-profits exist - Chris Hall's work at Wagon Hill- 5<sup>th</sup> grade. These examples allow opportunities to see how a student's work can make a difference in your own community.

Maggie- mentioned that Dr. Morse told her that having a discussion with teachers about incorporating aspects of sustainability would be best done in August.

Todd: In reality it may be helpful to meet before the summer at the HS.

Senior Science Showcase has spotlighted and raised the awareness of sustainability/environmental learning. student work locally through science experiments.

Discussion has taken place at the HS about requiring a "Capstone" event - potential to have more meaning

Next Gen Standards - K-5 sustainability Thread will need to be worked on. At 6-12 sustainability threads of sustainability may be a little more tricky

4. Identify initiatives that supports effective sustainable education. Integrate ideas into their real world work.

Maggie- Talking with department about Johns' research assignment and have the Green Team Leaders support and help with planning or student work.

Todd: Science is a natural connection for sustainability and talking to department chairs would help understand possibilities that ORSC and/or Green Team leaders could support.

English is another possible area where sustainability could be included

Social Students (World Culures) - many also have choices exist

Parent may have to also drive. GT leaders will drive to give more seat space for students.

Earth Day celebrations will include Maggie reading a book to classrooms at Mast Way and making clay milkweed balls and "seedballs" to be placed along the "right of way" powerlines beside school.

Next year at Mast Way, a Lee resident will be taking every 2<sup>nd</sup> grade class out into the Lee Forest. For the past 30 years, this Lee resident has also taken Mast Way students outside each week for one hour to learn about animals and the environment.
